
What You'll Need

1 The First Steps


Classical Guitarist and Recording Engineer

first takes of a piece of your choosing.






O2 The Edit


3 All about Dynamics


O4 Critical Listening

In this lesson, we will listen back to your recordings and I will try to give as much feedback as possible! We will use several measurement tools to counter the problem that not every one of us has access to an acoustically treated studio with a set of flat frequency response monitor speakers.



O 5 Audio & Video

Bringing together audio and video will uncover certain obstacles that we are going to tackle during this workshop. We will learn how to use the industry-standard NLE (non-linear editor) Blackmagic DaVinci Resolve to import our audio and video files and will learn how to synchronize those recordings.
